# PASTORAL MESSAGE FROM FR. SUBI THOMAS



As we continue through the Lenten season its worth meditating on the Cross of Jesus. The Cross. The instrument of a shameful death. It was not lawful to condemn a Roman citizen to death by crucifixion: it was too humiliating. But that moment that Jesus, a Jew, took up the Cross, carrying it to Calvary, marked a turning-point in the history of the Cross. The symbol of a shameful death, reserved for the lowest classes, the Cross, became a sign of victory and a crown of glory! Every time I look at the Cross, it gives me courage and hope. Death, under the Cross, is not an ending, it is a beginning.

The Cross is a divine lesson in obedience and humility. Jesus humbled Himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross (Phil 2:6-8). For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by one man's obedience many will be made righteous (Romans 5:19). By submitting to death, Jesus had destroyed its power, thereby making eternal life available to everyone. The Cross, an emblem of suffering and shame became the centerpiece of God's plan of redemption. Christ suffered to leave us a divine example of every virtue which we could imitate - love, charity, humility, obedience, patience and forbearance.

The Church offers a great number of suggestions for spiritual progress during Lent. One common devotion is the Way of the Cross, which is more commonly referred to as the Stations of the Cross.

Our parishes celebrate the Stations of the Cross on a weekly basis (Friday Noon) during Lent. This communal celebration offers several benefits. First, it enters the action of prayer into our daily planner. How often do we intend to pray, and yet fail to make the time? Joining in a parish celebration of the Stations of the Cross provides a concrete time that we can commit to prayer. Secondly, Christianity is not an individual sport. Parish celebrations of the Stations of the Cross provide an opportunity for fellowship.

Please take the time to participate in the Stations of the Cross this Lenten Season.

Enrollment for the 2023-2024 school year has begun! Christ Child Academy is a 3K preschool through 8th grade Catholic school serving the community of and around Sheboygan.

During the 2023-2024 school year, our 3K program will be offered five mornings per week and will be held in the Extended Day Program building from 8:00-11:15 am. The 4K program will continue to be offered five days per week with full and half day options and will be held in our current 4K classroom. Christ Child Academy is a part of the Wisconsin Private School Choice Program (WPCP). This program allows eligible students to attend our school tuition-free through a state aid payment, on behalf of the student's parent or guardian. It means eliminating barriers to Catholic schooling for eligible families. Family eligibility is subject to WPCP income and residency requirements. The WPCP application dates run from February 1, 2023 through April 20, 2023.

## STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

### EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

#### He Is the Living Water

When I think about the story of the Samaritan woman at the well, I think of my father. This Gospel reading that we use every year for the First Scrutiny of the RCIA was always my favorite to discuss with those who would be baptized in just a few weeks at the Easter Vigil. Not that many years ago, my father was one of those elect. That year, the story was more powerful than ever.

The woman went frequently to the well looking to get the water that would sustain her body. But in the story, Jesus tells her of a different kind of water, one that gives life and quenches even the driest of thirsts. The story tells us that she put down her water jar and ran to the town telling of her encounter with the One who may be the Christ. She left that jar at the well. She did not need it anymore.

I encounter people all the time that spend their days going up the hill to draw water. They are tired and spent. My father was one of those. But with the gift of baptismal water, that constant chore is now over. There is no need to travel up that hill.

This Lent, if you are one of the baptized, reclaim the gift of your baptism. Stop climbing that hill in search of something that can only quench your thirst temporarily. You encountered Christ and have the everlasting, living water already. Put down that water jar. Your new life has only just begun.

### CALLED AND GIFTED

The Called & Gifted™ Discernment Process has been used since 1993 by over 100,000 lay, ordained, and religious Catholics, and other Christians around the world. It is designed to help Christians discern the presence of charisms in their lives. Charisms, or spiritual gifts, are special abilities given to all Christians by the Holy Spirit to give them power both to represent Christ and to be a channel of God's goodness for people. Whether extraordinary or ordinary, all charisms ought to be exercised in the service of God (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2003). All three parts of the process are necessary for discovering where you are gifted.

- Part One is the Called and Gifted workshop, which lays the foundation for the beginning of discernment. During the initial Called & Gifted workshop series the participants will take the Catholic Spiritual Gifts Inventory.
- Part Two is the one-hour gifts interview, an invaluable part of the process.
- Part Three helps you begin discernment in the real world. It will teach you how to:
  - develop charism experiment
  - evaluate your results
  - identify ways you learned to control life as a child that get in the way of using your charisms as an adult

There will a workshop on **Saturday, April 29 from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. at St. Dominic Parish.** The cost for lunch, snacks, Part one and Part two, workbook, unlimited access to Part three discernment small groups, and access to the online education platform for six-months is \$44. Our community is so committed to this approach to grow disciples, we will cover \$20 of the cost for early registrants before March 15. 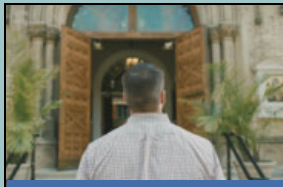
