

PASTORAL MESSAGE FROM FR. PAUL FLISS



I pray everyone is finding your personal Lenten journey fruitful this year. Today we join with Christ in his Transfiguration, and the bumbling response of Peter to the wonderful vision. I pray none of us ever be "terrified" by an experience of God. We have been praying for our candidates and catechumens as they make their journey to the Easter Sacraments. Today, Terry, our catechumen, will be going down to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election. Then the group of us will share in a meal together. Please keep Terry and all those celebrating the Easter Sacraments in your prayers, including our Confirmands, and First

Communicants.

On another topic, I want to offer some clarification on the intentions for each Mass. Over the past few years, the Chancery Office at the Archdiocese has updated policies concerning the Mass intentions. We have always followed their lead. The norm is to have one intention for each Mass. It most often is for a deceased relative or friend, but it can also be for the living, or an intention that is more like a petition, like for example, "For World Peace." One Mass a weekend within our collaboration must be "For the People of the Parishes." Often you might see "Priest's Intention," written by a Mass. This is a place holder intention, meaning no parishioner offered an intention for the Mass, so the priest supplies one for that Mass. It is not the preferred way to offer intentions. It is better for parishioners to offer the intentions for Mass. When you do offer an intention, Fr. Subi and I will mention the intention either within the Eucharistic prayer, or as a last intercession at the Mass. I hope this clarification helps, and that we all find value in praying the intentions for Mass.

The 4K program will continue to be offered five days per week with full and half day options and will be held in our current 4K classroom. Christ Child Academy is a part of the Wisconsin Private School Choice Program (WPCP). This program allows eligible students to attend our school tuition-free through a state aid payment, on behalf of the student's parent or guardian. It means eliminating barriers to Catholic schooling for eligible families. Family eligibility is subject to WPCP income and residency requirements. The WPCP application dates run from February 1, 2023 through April 20, 2023.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Beyond Your Comfort Zone

Catherine Doherty said, "Yes, stewardship pertains to everything and I am responsible for my part of that everything." I am reminded of that quote when I read the words from Paul's Second Letter to Timothy, "Beloved: Bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God." Both point to our own responsibility as a disciple, as well as the reality that we are not alone. We live with God in community. We each have our part to play in the kingdom of God.

Lent is an important time to focus on how our stewardship way of life causes us to sacrifice and, at times, experience hardship. If we find that we never seem to feel our sacrifice, then it is a good time to ask ourselves if we really are fully living as good stewards, cultivating what we have been given, and then offering it all back to God. If we only give from our excess, then we will never understand the meaning behind the words of St. Paul and Catherine Doherty.

This is why we must challenge ourselves. We must push ourselves to go that extra mile. It really is a way of exercising our stewardship muscles. So as this Lenten season is still in its first weeks, what can you attempt to do that really pushes you out of your comfort zone? Can you double or triple your prayer time during the season? Can you search your household and give to charity more than just things you don't need anymore, but also things you still want? Is there someone to visit a few times before Easter than can no longer get out? Whatever it is, the strength will come from God to take greater care of your part of his everything.

COMMUNITY NEWS

CALLED AND GIFTED

The Called & Gifted™ Discernment Process has been used since 1993 by over 100,000 lay, ordained, and religious Catholics, and other Christians around the world. It is designed to help Christians discern the presence of charisms in their lives. Charisms, or spiritual gifts, are special abilities given to all Christians by the Holy Spirit to give them power both to represent Christ and to be a channel of God's goodness for people. Whether extraordinary or ordinary, all charisms ought to be exercised in the service of God (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2003). All three parts of the process are necessary for discovering where you are gifted.

- Part One is the Called and Gifted workshop, which lays the foundation for the beginning of discernment. During the initial Called & Gifted workshop series the participants will take the Catholic Spiritual Gifts Inventory.
- Part Two is the one-hour gifts interview, an invaluable part of the process.
- Part Three helps you begin discernment in the real world. It will teach you how to:
- develop charism experiment
- evaluate your results
- identify ways you learned to control life as a child that get in the way of using your charisms as an adult

There will a workshop on Saturday, April 29 from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m. at St. Dominic Parish. The cost for lunch, snacks, Part one and Part two, workbook, unlimited access to Part three discernment small groups, and access to the online education platform for six-months is \$44. Our community is so committed to this approach to grow disciples, we will cover \$20 of the cost for early registrants before March 15.
